Instructions for the Pre-event Exercise

Josie's single word (SW) and conversational speech (CS) screening samples will be reviewed in the master class. Participants may wish to work on them prior to the event, and bring their observations for discussion on the first day. This is purely voluntary. REFERRING TO THE SINGLE WORD SCREENING SAMPLE

1. Tally Josie's consonants correct out of 100 and calculate a tentative Percentage of Consonants Correct (tentative because this is a small screening sample).
2. Tally her vowels correct out of 47 and calculate a tentative Percentage of Vowels Correct.
3. Using the screening analysis form, identify the phonological processes present, noting any other processes not listed on the form, and any other errors. Estimate percentages of occurrence of the processes if you wish remembering that these are also extremely tentative.

REFERRING TO THE SINGLE WORD SCREENING SAMPLE AND THE CS SAMPLE

1. Circle or list the vowels and consonants present in the samples (the vowel and consonant inventories).
2. List any vowel and /or consonant inventory constraints.
3. Circle the marked consonants present in her samples.
4. List the phonotactic combinations: CV, VC, CVC ...(syllable/word shape inventory)
5. Note any idiosyncratic or unusual features.
6. Note examples of chronological mismatch, if any.
7. List her syllable stress inventory (assuming typical stress patterns) S = strong W = weak.
8. Note any examples of homonymy.
9. Based on this small sample, which phones are used contrastively in Josie's system?
10. Are there any non-contrastive phones, and if so, what are they?
